## - Important Safety Guidelines for Everyone -

**Make safety your most important priority when handling, transporting, storing, and shooting airguns. Make it a routine to follow all the rules of safe gun handling.**

**YOU MUST:**

- ALWAYS** follow the rules of safe gun handling. Always be aware of your surroundings, and those people around you.
- ALWAYS** treat an airgun as if it were loaded.
- ALWAYS** aim an airgun in a safe direction and **ALWAYS** keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction.
- ALWAYS** keep an airgun "on safe" until you are ready to shoot.
- ALWAYS** wear shooting glasses and make sure those with you wear them too.
- ALWAYS** use the proper caliber ammunition and **NEVER** reuse ammunition.
- ALWAYS** be sure of your target and **ALWAYS** be sure your target has a safe backstop.
- ALWAYS** place your backstop in a location that will be safe should the backstop fail.
- ALWAYS** check to see if an airgun is "on safe" and unloaded when getting it from another person or from storage.
- ALWAYS** read and follow the owner's manual and all

instructions and know how the airgun works before using it.

**ALWAYS** keep your finger off the trigger and out of the trigger guard until you are aiming at your target and are ready to shoot.

**ALWAYS** store an airgun in a safe place so that it cannot be used by anyone who is unauthorized.

**YOU MUST:**

- NEVER** point an airgun at any person.
- NEVER** load an airgun until you are ready to shoot.
- NEVER** point an airgun at anything you do not intend to shoot.
- NEVER** shoot at hard surfaces, water, or anything that could cause a ricochet.
- NEVER** put an airgun away loaded.

You must also follow all state and local laws about the purchase, ownership, and use of airguns. Most airguns are intended for use by those only of certain age, therefore, adult supervision is required. And remember, misuse or careless use of airguns may cause serious injury or death.

**Be safe, have fun, and happy airgunning.**

### Notice Non-lead pellets:

Non-lead pellets such as Gamo PBA, RWS Hyper-Speed, Crosman Lead-Free and others are generally lighter weight than similar lead pellets and may result in higher velocity. The non-lead alloy is much harder than lead and may result in greater penetration and a greater tendency to rebound. **DO NOT** use non-lead pellets with any metal pellet trap or target. They are for outdoor use only. Always be extra sure to ensure a safe shooting area well beyond the target.

*We do not recommend using lightweight pellets in high powered airguns. Always follow any recommendations supplied by the manufacturer.*

### Three ways to ruin your airgun.

- 1) Dry fire**  
Never allow anyone to dry fire any spring powered airgun i.e. NEVER fire without a pellet. Doing so can cause damage to the spring, piston and seals.
- 2) Wrong lubricants.**  
Too much or the wrong lube can cause damage to the piston seal and other parts. Use only approved lubricants in the compression chamber & spring area. Use only one or two drops. Wait 24+ hours before use.
- 3) Don't read.**  
Failure to read or follow cocking and loading instructions can cause damage to the airgun and/or injury to the shooter or others. Airguns with a cocking lever release require that all users know the proper cocking procedure.
